Dear Friends

In March this year, a new Archbishop was installed in Canterbury Cathedral in the same week that a new Pope was inaugurated in Rome. I am writing this letter on the day these two men met for the first time in Rome.

A few days before his historic meeting with Pope Francis, the Archbishop of Canterbury visited Suffolk. Although we weren't in the congregation at Aldeburgh, D and I were privileged, with many other people, to meet him and hear him talking about his job. I hope I can share with you the air of optimism which he gives to those who meet him.

I will not try to describe Archbishop Justin, except to say that he looks exactly like the photographs of him that appear in the newspapers. He is slight in build and unimpressive in stature, but his face glows with laughter, interest, thoughtfulness and compassion.

I cannot give you a full account of all he said, but while we were with him he spoke of his surprise at being called to this office, and of the joy that doing the job gives him; he says it is the best job in the world.

He spoke of the three priorities that guide him in all that he does:

The first is a call to all, and to members of the Church in particular, to a life of faith and faithfulness based on prayer; faithfulness to the example of Jesus Christ, to his teaching and his self-giving service.

His second priority is a call to reconciliation. He has a reputation for this, having put his own life on the line when working with various warring groups in Nigeria and in other parts of the world, but he says that we all have a part to play in this. Reconciliation is what happens when we acknowledge God's love, and allow it to flow through us to the people around us and particularly to those with whom we find it difficult to agree.

His third priority is evangelism. Not the sort of mass-meeting spectacular along the lines of Billy Graham, but the quiet witness that makes known the reality of life through Jesus Christ and the healing and comfort we can receive through him.

The Archbishop believes that people all over the world are hungry for God's peace, and that they long for truth and integrity, for gentleness and virtue.

Archbishop Justin believes the Church's task now is to show the world what God's love means today. It is as simple as that.

I have to tell you, his optimism has rubbed off on us. We look forward to seeing how exciting the next ten or so years are going to be.

MESSAGE FROM ROBIN

Some alert Readers may have seen or read about unusual goings-on in Ipswich Crown Court, recently. Perhaps an explanation is due.

Each year, The Queen appoints a High Sheriff in each country of this country; the holder of this historic office is traditionally responsible to The Queen for the safety of justice within the country, for the protection of her judges and magistrates and for overseeing the workings of the justice system. Of course, nowadays, the office is largely ceremonial, because the justice system is administered by a Government Department, and the security of the judges and of prisoners is delivered by contract.

Traditionally each High Sheriff appoints a chaplain; in years past, his role was to hear the confession of condemned criminals, administer absolution and witness the death penalty. Happily there is no call for this task today.

This year, the High Sheriff of Suffolk is Sir Edward Greenwell, who lives near Orford. For reasons too complicated to explain, he asked me to act as his Chaplain for his year in office. He was sworn in (it is an impressive oath of office) before the Resident Judge in Ipswich Crown Court in April, during which ceremony I had to lead prayers. Since then I have accompanied him on a number of visits to various parts of the justice system located in Suffolk.

It was on one such visit to the Crown Court, two weeks ago, when The High Sheriff and I were sitting either side of the Judge who had just sentenced a prisoner, that a member of the public left the public gallery, ran across the court, climbed onto the bench and attempted to assault the Judge. As you can imagine, it was The High Sheriff and I who became the first line of defence, but we were quickly relieved by Police, court officials and the man's parents. The man's actions constituted contempt, a serious offence, and the following day he found himself sentenced to a term of imprisonment.

KETTLEBURGH VILLAGE GREEN NEWS

Join the Suffolk Coast Bike Ride for St Elizabeth Hospice

Join other St Elizabeth Hospice supporters for a cycle ride through the idyllic Suffolk countryside on Sunday 4th August.

Starting and finishing at Glemham Hall, the event features a choice of two routes; one is 35 miles, the other a more challenging 60 miles.

Both head north through pretty countryside and villages before splitting at Sibton. The short route then swings east towards Dunwich on the coast, while the longer continues north to reach Covehithe with its curious 'Russian Doll' churches. Following the coast south, the long route rejoins the short route near Dunwich, crossing open heathland to finish back at Glemham Hall.

Emily Sullivan, of St Elizabeth Hospice, said: "This event is suitable for experienced cyclists and road bikes, hybrids or mountain bikes are recommended. There will be some stunning scenery to take in and we hope the Suffolk Coast Bike Ride will raise thousands of

pounds to help us to continue to provide local hospice care for local people." Entry fees are £17.50 in advance for adults or £20 on the day or £8 for children under 14. Teams of 6 or more can also enter for £16.50 in advance. Riders can set off between 8am - 10am at a time to suit you.

INTER-VILLAGES ROUNDERS TOURNAMENT

I am pleased to reveal the entry details for this year's Suffolk Coastal Inter-Village Rounders Tournament which takes place on **September 8th** at Sutton Memorial Hall / Recreation Ground (IP12 3JQ).

- The one-day tournament (now in its third year) will be contested by a maximum of 12 villages and entry will be on a first-come, first-serve basis (based on an entry form being returned to me).
- The day will approximately run from 11am 5pm but this will be confirmed closer to the time and will depend on the number of teams participating
- All participating villages must come from the Suffolk Coastal district
- Squads can be made up of between 9 and 15 people with a minimum of 6 females. All squad members can bat in each game but only 9 people can field at one time (4 must be female)
- All participants must be at least 16 years of age
- All participating teams must contain a qualified rounders umpire who will attend our course on Sunday 11th August in Sutton (10am). This course will take a maximum of three hours and will be paid for by Suffolk Sport. This person will be required to do a little bit of umpiring during the tournament itself but not during their team's games!
- Entry is £20 per team and all equipment will be provided. Payment will not be required immediately
- A rounders 'refresher' will be offered to all villages to give them a re-introduction to the rules / equipment etc.
- Rules will be circulated in plenty of time before the event and they will be slightly different to those currently being used in our summer league. They will 'loosely' be based on Rounders England's simplified rules.

TIMES PAST

I myself write as from the past, but wanted to share with you my sadness at the loss of Wilda, archivist and recorder for the villages. Her work over the years in tracing so much of the history of the two parishes has been quite remarkable. There can have been few people, perhaps no- one, in all the long story of Brandeston and Kettleburgh, who knew so much about their origins, development, buildings, farms, - and above all, the people. Working with Wilda on a project demanded complete commitment. Setting up that series of exhibitions in All Saints' Church in the 1980s and 90s springs to mind. On one occasion I recall spending so much time there that Stella suggested I should have a bed in the vestry! Wilda was so thorough. Every detail had to be teased out of documents, every reference verified. And all this was in addition to her other artistic gifts. How many churches have such a record of their parish flora and fauna in embroidery as Brandeston? Her loss will be felt by many. She knew the answers to so many of our questions. One hopes that the archive of her achievements will be preserved and treasured - Times Past, into Times to come.
