

#### The Wickham Market Cycle Race

I have always been a hoarder and for many years have been storing articles of local interest cut from local newspapers. I was recently going through one of my folders containing pieces cut from the much missed 'Woodbridge Reporter', when I saw a headline saying, "Pioneers of Wickham Market cycling". Apparently, the newly formed cycle club decided on a novel way of choosing their first captain in 1879. It was a race from the White Hart to the Woodbridge Sun pub and back! This event was under 10 years from the invention of the two wheeled machine, known as the bicycle and these brave men were riding PENNY FARTHINGS"! Right at the start of the race the machine, ridden by Mr A. White collapsed and he fell heavily. A number of other riders gave up, having had enough by the time they reached Pettistree (less than a mile!) where they found the pull of The Three Tuns, too much! The Dale brothers and one Reuben Whitehead kept going until Frank Dale took a tumble at Melton, near the old toll booth, but the other pair carried on. Reuben completed the 9- mile course in 42 minutes, a speed of 13 miles an hour on dirt roads, and I assume was duly made captain.

Earlier that century, a local doctor, Mr Thomas Harsant did his rounds on what was called a "dandy" otherwise known as a "Hobby horse". This was invented by a London coachbuilder named John Denis who called it a "Pedestrian curricle" (a bit of a mouthful!) The rider sat on a seat suspended between the wheels and propelled the machine with his feet pushing on the ground.

I recently saw a very young child on a small modern version of this machine, with pneumatic tyres, going at quite a pace around Framlingham football field, and I was surprised by how fast he was going.

Please don't worry, I do not intend to take up the sport, so you are quite safe!

#### From the Rev'd Graham Hedger

In July the news was dominated by a small group of stories: the progress of the England football team and the dramatic search and rescue of 12 boys and their coach from a cave in Thailand. For over two weeks the world held its breath as divers searched for, and then attempted to rescue the 13 trapped people. The daily and hourly news fed our appetite as many willed them on, hoping against hope that the boys would be found and rescued. We sat in admiration as divers risked their lives (with one sadly loosing his life in the attempt) working their way through narrow openings to reach the boys. We became aware of the problems of the race against time, to rescue them before the monsoon season struck in full force. Cave divers and experts from around the world came to offer their support and expertise. It was a truly magnificent effort, and one which ended with the successful rescue of all 13 people. We rejoiced with the crowds as the final boys and their coach were airlifted to hospital.

Just occasionally we get glimpses of a better world. Where people look beyond themselves, their background, their nation and their political or religious creed to a shared humanity and have a desire to make the world a better place. This is a sign of God's nature within us. The Bible tells us that each one of us is made in the image of God, yet that image is marred by our wilfulness to turn from God but is marvellously restored when we turn to Christ. We have great potential, but we need to make that decision to turn to Him as Saviour to realise that potential.

#### **Prayer in the benefice**

For many years a group of people have met once a month on the Friday preceding the Benefice Service to pray in the church where the service will be held. From August 31st this will become a weekly occurrence. We will continue to meet in the church where the first Sunday of the month Benefice service is held. We will continue to meet in that church for the following weeks up to the Friday before the next Benefice service. The time of prayer will be at 4pm on Fridays, for about 15 minutes and be a very simple format. All are welcome to come and join us.

#### In Memory of Rev'd Roger Dixon of Brandeston

At the end of June, we held a memorial service in Brandeston for the life and ministry of the Rev'd Roger Dixon. He was both a dedicated priest, friend to all and also a great teacher. #### Brandeston Memorial to benefit from Hopkins Homes' fund

Brandeston war memorial has been awarded a grant from the Hopkins Homes War Memorials fund to support repair and conservation work. As part of the £500,000 Hopkins Charitable Fund announced last year, the awardwinning developer committed to supporting the repair and conservation of East Anglia's war memorials through a £10,000 a year donation to War Memorials Trust. James Hopkins, Executive Chairman of Hopkins Homes said: "The Brandeston war memorial is important to local heritage, and particularly so this year as the nation commemorates the centenary of the end of World War I. Hopkins Homes is proud to support this conservation work as part of our ongoing commitment to community projects. "Brandeston's war memorial, located in the churchyard of the village's Grade I listed All Saints Church was erected in 1920 following donations from the public and now commemorates the fallen of both World Wars. The memorial is a Latin cross made of red granite fixed onto a York stone base. The front face of the cross carries a World War I inscription with names sited on the plinth. The war memorial was identified as in need of repair and conservation works as the names have become very difficult to read. The £850 grant has been offered through War Memorials Trust Grants scheme, supported by Hopkins Homes, towards works which include cleaning the stone by hand, re-painting some of the raised lead lettering to match the original design, and removing rust from the ironwork railings followed by priming and re-painting. Frances Moreton, Director of War Memorials Trust said: "Hopkins Homes' generous donation is helping to support war memorials in East Anglia and make sure that works undertaken follow best conservation practice.
